Advocacy and Prevention

Bantwana engages communities through awareness campaigns, trainings, and discussions that empower recognise and challenge individuals to behaviours. Through partnering with local leaders, community groups, and schools, Bantwana fosters a supportive environment where survivors can seek help, and prevention becomes a shared responsibility. Our advocacy efforts also include policy engagement, ensuring that local and national stakeholders are committed to addressing GBV and supporting longterm change.

CASE MANAGEMENT STEPS



ASSESSEMENT Evaluation of the physical, emotional, and legal needs is conducted to determine

necessary support and resources



CARE PLAN

Step that involves developing a personalised, actionable strategy to address needs.



FOLLOW UP

A plan is developed, detailing actions to be taken, and follow well-being, safety, and progress toward recovery



IDENTIFICATION GBV through awareness and outreach programs



DOCUMENTATION

personal info, evidence, and statements, for tracking, lega



REFERRAL

Ensures they receive specialised services when their needs extend beyond the case manager's scope.



CASE CLOSURE

This involves summariSing progress, ensuring continuity of care if needed, and formally ending the relationship in a supportive manner
