GBV cases reported in 2020, corresponding to 0.2% of Uganda's population (based on the estimated population of 44 million in 2020) (UNFPA, UG, 2020)

Injuries which were as a result of GBV and reported to the police in 2020 (UNFPA, UG, 2020)

18,872

Victims of domestic violence in 2020: 3,408 male adults, 13,145 female adults, 1,133 male juveniles and 1,186 female juveniles (Annual Police Crime Report, 2020)
